

## The Penrose Inquiry

### Latest News


The Penrose Inquiry has now published its Preliminary Report. Working with the local groups, Haemophilia Scotland conducted a series of meetings around Scotland so that members could respond and talk directly to the legal team. The deadline for response was the 31 October 2010 but this has now been extended to 14 November 2010.

The Haemophilia Scotland has successfully applied to be a Core Participant in the Penrose Inquiry and has also been awarded funding to allow Thompsons Solicitors to provide legal representation. Thompsons have also appointed a QC to lead our case and two junior counsel.
